NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCEDURE		
Nomination Deadline	May 1st	October 15th
Nomination Procedure (<i>by home institution</i>)	Home institutions must nominate their students by email with the following student's information : full name, email address, field, level and current year of study. Nominated students will receive an email with the instructions for registration and application, together with the online application link.	
Application Deadline	May 15th	October 31st
Application Procedure (<i>by student</i>)	Before applying, the international student should, firstly, check if there is an existing partnership between Bordeaux INP and the home institution establishing an academic or double degree exchange. If so, they should seek then an authorization from the institution of origin. Once the international student has been nominated by their Home Institution, we will send them the application instructions they should follow. If there is no partnership, nor academic exchange agreement between the two institutions, the international student must follow the " Etudes en France " procedure.	
Application Documents (<i>provided by the student</i>)	The following documents must be uploaded when applying online: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A resume (in French or in English) - A cover letter (in French or in English) - Their Learning Agreement (doable through the OLA platform) - Their Academic transcript of records - A Proof of language proficiency (French B1 recommended) Be aware that additional documents may be asked during the enrolment process.	

Acceptance	The International Office will send by email a "Letter of Acceptance" to the student within 3 weeks after online application deadline.
ACADEMIC INFORMATION FOR LEARNING AGREEMENT	
Syllabus	<p>The syllabus for the Engineering Programme in Cognitive Sciences (IICOG) can be consulted HERE. An English version of the syllabus is available by clicking on the flag.</p> <p>Please note that <u>only the "IICOG Engineer in Human Engineering and Cognitive Technology"</u> is open to incoming students and that it is mainly taught in French.</p> <p>However, an international semester programme taught in English has been implemented during Semester 9 (first semester of the last year of training, equating to a Master 2 level). For more information regarding this English-taught programme, please do not hesitate to contact us.</p>
Courses Choice	<p>Before the start of their academic exchange at ENSC, prospective students must choose the courses they are willing to follow and seek its recognition from the academic advisors at their home university as well as at the receiving university. Prospective students from the EU, EEA or Switzerland, must fill their Learning Agreement online through the OLA platform provided that their Home Institution is connected to the platform.</p> <p>If that is not the case or if the prospective student is from outside the EU, EEA and Switzerland, the Learning Agreement template will be provided later on by the International Relations Officer.</p> <p>Confirmation of the choice of courses/modules must be done at their arrival, depending on the availability of courses and the authorisation of the programme director.</p>

Language Requirements	<p>Most of our courses are taught in French. If international students would like to follow courses in French, they are required to take a language test in French upon arrival. So, it is recommended to have a B1 Level in French according the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).</p> <p>French courses called FLE (<i>Français Langue Étrangère</i>) are offered for those whose level is insufficient.</p> <p>However, starting the 2023-2024 Academic Year, some classes may be taught in English for non-French speaking students. A B2 level certificate of proficiency (TOEFL, IELTS) in English is expected from them.</p>
PRATICAL INFORMATION	
Visa	<p>Students from a member state of the EU or EEA, or Switzerland, do not need a visa to reside in France during their academic exchange.</p> <p>However, students who are not from a member state of the EU or EEA, or Switzerland, need to follow a visa procedure. Depending on the nationality, the situation and the length of the stay, the student may be able to obtain a visa to</p>

<p>Accommodation - CROUS</p>	<p>It is possible for an international student to get a CROUS accommodation. The provided accommodation is a room in a CROUS dormitory or a studio in a CROUS residence. But be aware that the CROUS has a limited number of rooms reserved for exchange students. We cannot fully guarantee a room. So, students are strongly advised to do their accommodation research well in advance. Also, they should only book their accommodation after having received their official admission letter.</p> <p>Students coming for a semester have to apply via the following link : trouverunlogement.lescrous.fr/ (available in English). International students will be able to submit their housing applications starting July 12th (no Student Social File to complete).</p> <p>Students coming for at least two semesters have to complete an International Student Accommodation Form called Student Social File (DSE) before April 30th HERE (website also available in English).</p> <p>For assistance, please contact us at international@ensc.fr.</p>
<p>Health Insurance</p>	<p>The student will not be required to pay social security contributions. He will need to register on the dedicated website for students in order to be covered for his medical expenses, except if he has a European health insurance card.
